Out of the total population, 38.4% of those under the age of 18 and 14.0% of those 65 and older are living below the poverty line. Erie County has an average income significantly lower than the national average and has a greater percentage of persons over the age of 55 than New York State and the United States. Erie County's population is projected to decrease between now and 2017, with the greatest decline expected in those ages 35-54, and the greatest increase projected in those 55 and over. Erie County is less racially and ethnically diverse than New York State or the rest of the country, and the Non-White populations are concentrated in and immediately around the City of Buffalo. All of the 11 zip codes in Erie County that have a Non-White population of 50% or more are in Buffalo. The loss of traditional jobs in manufacturing, rapid suburbanization and high costs of labor led to the area's economic decline over the last few decades, making Buffalo one of the poorest among major U.S. cities with populations of more than 250,000 people. Recent investments in medical, educational and bio-tech sectors have led to improvements in the local economy.
